


SPINA 3 Planimetria scala 1:2000

The master plan envisaged the creation of an urban complex of 33,000.00 square meters of surface built and 9,000 square meters underground for parking and services. The project: a platform for trade, services and car parks, three towers of 21-23 floors and six buildings in a line along the edges of the block. 




Final residential configuration



































The Housing Cooperative Giuseppe Di Vittorio was born in 1972, in the undivided property, with the aim of meeting the housing needs through the permanent location for citizens too poor to be on the free market and too rich to be entitled to a public house.

Since then, the cooperative has built about 5.000 apartments: all of them assigned in location; about these, after 20 years, 1.780 homes were assigned to the property of the members tenants.

The cooperative has gone through 40 years of history in these four major phases summarized as follows:

- 1st. Construction of large amounts of housing, very focused, to deal with immigration from southern Italy;
- 2<sup>nd</sup>. Attention to the architectural quality of building work and construction;
- 3<sup>rd</sup>. Policies wich follows the quality of urban and social interventions, considering both the social mix and the generations-one:

Current phase: confirmation of the principles of quality architecture, construction and urban planning; attention to sustainability policies related to the construction world.
